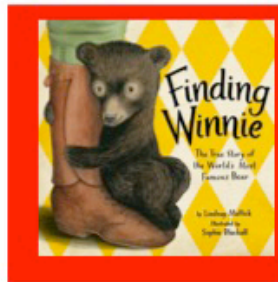
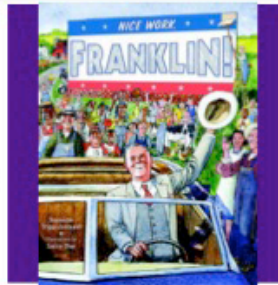

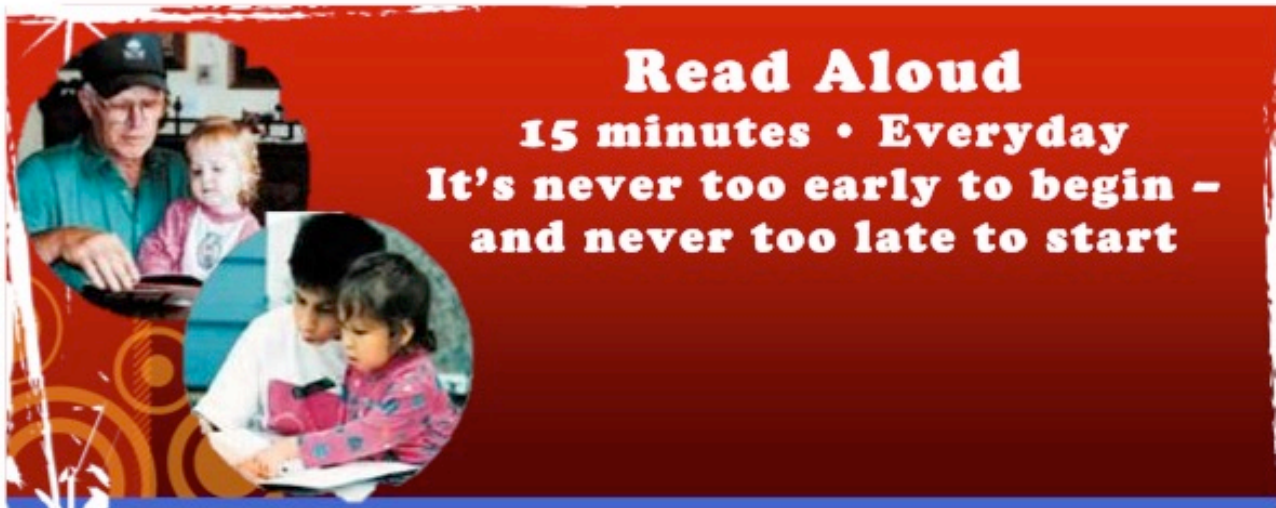

Action steps:
